CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Pro Tem Taylor called the study session to order at 5:33 p.m.

ROLL CALL

Council Members present were: Jones, Morton, Ott, Whalen, Taylor and Zaroudny.

STAFF PRESENT

City Administrator Mukerjee, Police Chief Rhoads, Public Works Director Neal, Finance Director Tylor, and Deputy City Clerk Stevenson-Ness.

STUDY ITEMS:

A. AB12-039: Drug Loitering/Prostitution Ordinances Discussion

Chief Rhoads explained the reason for the Ordinance is that there are areas that are included in the newly annexed area that will need attention from a law enforcement standpoint. The areas have not had any real enforcement actions for several decades and have become a harbor for drug and prostitution activity.

He also discussed the SODA and SOAP orders and explained their uses as a concerted effort on proactive enforcement.

There was Council discussion regarding placement of the SODA and SOAP areas within the City and if the entire City should be labeled as such.

B. AB12-040: Visioning Process – Continued Discussion



The consensus of Council is that they look into the Visioning Process further in the spring of 2013.
