7. REGULAR AGENDA

A. Work Plan Item - Update on Parking Code

Commissioner Balsley reported on nuisance parking issues the City is dealing with. Balsley went on a ride along with Officer Hobbs who showed vehicles that are parked in City right of way for extended periods of time without moving. (Pictures of such vehicles were passed out to each member for better understanding) Such cars create a nuisance for the city making some of the already narrow roads impassable for emergency service vehicles. Hobbs suggested the City take code from the City of Puyallup to address this problem. Discussion was held regarding inviting Officer Hobbs to a future meeting. A copy of the Puyallup and Milton extended parking code were handed out.

B. Work Plan Item – Sidewalk Prioritization Plan

Nothing to report.

C. Work Plan Item – Vacant Building Regulations

Chair Gillespie recently met with State Senator Mark Miloscia and discussed his research into vacant buildings in the City. Gillespie gave examples of ideas that have been done in Everett and Tucson and is working on looking at some other city codes and formulating a plan for Milton to enact a fee for vacant buildings. Enforcement will be a challenge but Gillespie has ideas on this also.

D. Work Plan Item – Prioritization and Timelines

Commissioners decided to prioritize working on nuisance parking as their #1 goal and to hopefully have something done by the end of September. The #2 goal will be vacant buildings. Chair Gillespie will continue working on this and share information as it becomes available with the rest of the group. The #3 goal will be to study the Accessory Dwelling Unit code.

E. Work Plan Item – Milton Days

Commissioner Balsley explained that as much or as little time as you can give is acceptable but a time commitment is necessary and there is no cost to the commission for having a booth. Commissioner Whalen volunteered to spend some time in the booth. All other commissioners have commitments for other booths that day so are unable to commit. Commissioner LaVergne suggested that next year they plan a little ahead of time and have a dedicated booth for Milton Days.

Commissioner Balsley


- FME Food fight donations being accepted for Edgewood FISH food bank
