**CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Styron Sherrell called the meeting to order and led the flag salute.

**ROLL CALL**

Present: All Councilmembers are present.

**STAFF PRESENT**

Police Chief Hernandez, Public Works Director Afzali and City Clerk Trisha Summers.

**REGULAR AGENDA**

**A. Truck Route**

Public Works Director Afzali presented this item to council with a Power Point presentation. Revisions to the current truck route are needed in order to protect the safety of the public and the City's major roadways. The major change to the truck route is to eliminate Milton Way as a truck route.

Councilmembers thanked Mr. Afzali for a concise presentation and agreed that the route presented makes sense. There were clarifying questions asked regarding "thru traffic", education of existing businesses and cities about the new route and enforcement.

The truck route will come back to council for approval on October 7, 2019.

**B. CIP Update**

Public Works Director Afzali presented this item to council at a public hearing and discussion on September 3<sup>rd</sup> and again today with a brief Power Point presentation. The CIP is a plan that lays out a six-year road map identifying future capital and infrastructure needs for the City. The CIP is only a plan, not a budget. Any spending on the projects listed in the CIP are adopted when the City Council adopts its annual budget or is able to secure grant funding.


Councilmembers had reservations about costs of items in the plan such as a dog park and spray park. Council was also interested about where the Community Building should


fit into the plan. Mayor Styron Sherrell reiterated that the CIP is just a plan and that any spending on any project would need to be approved by the council. Mayor also explained that the idea for listing the spray park and dog park are that staff could possibly find grant funding for those but without them being listed in the plan, the city would have a harder time applying for grants to fund them.

The CIP will come back to council for approval on October 7, 2019.
